Level Cycle 2, secondary 5

Course Description and objectives

The object of study in Home Economics is Foods, Housing, and Clothing. The objective of the course is for the students to develop the competencies towards independent living. Students are provided with task oriented situations to manage their resources in food preparation budgeting, housing & design, and clothing care and construction.

General information and attendance requirements for all courses are described on the course outline supplement. The table below describes the specific competencies and the relative weighting for this subject.

Competency	Description	Weighting
1. Seeks solutions to practical life problems.	Determination of needs by researching a variety of resources in related areas. Examines the needs and resources from the perspective of a young adult. In class assignments.	20%
2. Develops independent management skills.	Practical application of management skills in planning and preparing projects related to food, clothing, and housing. Develops skills for managing resources from the point of view of foods, housing and clothing for the young adult, small projects.	30%
3. Carries out a process to strengthen his/her independent living skills.	Key features are cooking practices in the lab focusing on economical and healthy meals, sewing projects, and the development of a budget. Strengthens his or her independent living skills through the practice in a lab situation.	50%
